The Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will look to hire 5,000 employees. Both ICE and CBP fall under the USCIS. Executive Orders are Creating These Jobs: President Trump issued several Executive Orders to more strictly enforce immigration laws, through the stopping immigrants from coming into the US, building of a physical wall, easing the process for deporting undocumented immigrants and ending the policy known as "catch and release," among other policies. The ICE order directed the agency to "take all appropriate action" to hire enforcement and removal officers to the extent permitted by law "and subject to the availability of appropriations."
