First Semester Plan for Transfer Students Undecided about Major



If you are unclear about your major but you know that you want to complete a baccalaureate degree, you need to have a plan to make informed decisions about your education and your career. You need to be taking the correct courses to move you towards a timely graduation. This is why choosing an Exploratory Pathway, known as FOCI, is necessary.

- Education
- Health Professions
- Humanities
- Social Science
- STEM

During your first semester you should complete the following:

- Research careers by visiting the Career Services Office or Website (www.ColumbiaState.edu/Career-Services)
- Determine your top three career choices and declare the appropriate FOCI to guide your academic course selection.
- Investigate possible university transfer programs if applicable.
- Schedule to meet with your advisor by mid-semester to declare your official major and develop an academic plan.
- Register during Priority Registration week for your second semester classes.
